Collection Description

Biographical Note

Born in Athens, Georgia in 1903, John Daniel Martin Jr. graduated from the Emory School of Medicine in 1926 and completed his postgraduate work at the University of Vienna in 1929. Following his educational years, Dr. Martin returned to the Emory community where he became an instructor of surgery in 1931, eventually becoming an Assistant Professor of Clinical Surgery in 1938. After the entry of the United States into World War II, Dr. Martin and many of his Emory colleagues joined the 43rd General Hospital, a medical regiment also known as the Emory Unit. He served as Lieutenant Colonel and Associate Chief of Surgery of the 43rd General Hospital.

John Daniel Martin Jr. published over 150 medical papers during his career, and was the author of *The History of Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine*. He was also on the editorial committee for the book *The 43rd General Hospital - World War II, The Emory University Unit*. Dr. Martin was the Chief of Surgery at Emory University and also served as the former president of the Fulton County Medical Society, the Southern Surgical Association, and the Emory medical alumni.

Dr. Martin died in 1991 at the age of 88.

Scope and Content Note

The John Daniel Martin Jr. Papers consists of papers from his time as Lieutenant Colonel and Associate Chief of Surgery of the 43rd General Hospital during World War II. These papers include articles, material from a chest trauma study that focused on injuries sustained during the war, surgery reports including those performed on German POWs in 1945, and other military files related to the 43rd General Hospital. Also included are diary excerpts from Dr. Martin's journal which he kept during the war, and one photocopied letter from an Allied soldier thanking Dr. Martin for saving his life.
