Collection Description

Biographical Note

Born in Brooklyn, New York in 1942, Joseph Esposito moved to Georgia after he was named a recipient of the Borden Agricultural Scholarship at the University of Georgia. In 1970, Esposito earned his Ph.D. in microbiology at the University of Georgia, and soon after was employed at the Centers for Disease Control in Atlanta, where he would spend the next 37 years. During his time at the CDC, Esposito became Section Chief of the CDC's Pox Virus Section and director of the World Health Organization Collaborating Center for Smallpox and Other Poxvirus Infections. Esposito was involved in the Global Smallpox Eradication Program which officially eradicated the smallpox virus in 1980. After this program Esposito and his team at the CDC continued their research on the smallpox virus, investigating genome sequence diversity of the variola (smallpox) virus, providing insight to the evolution of the virus years after its eradication. In 2007, he received the Joseph E. McDade Award for Lifetime Achievement, given by the National Center for Preparedness, Detection, and Control of Infectious Diseases at the CDC. In the same year, he also received the James H. Nakano Award and was nominated for the CDC Charles Shepard Award for Lifetime Achievement.

Joseph Esposito died on March 1, 2014 in Atlanta.

Scope and Content Note

The Joseph Esposito Papers contain correspondence, photographs, printed material mostly related to the variola (smallpox) virus, audiovisual material, and scientific material Esposito used during his time at the CDC. Also includes awards and certificates Esposito earned throughout his career, personal material including a journal, business cards and passport, and a poster issued by the World Health Organization in 1978 announcing a reward for anyone who finds a confirmed case of smallpox.
