Born in Dunkirk, New York, Rose Cashman Dilday received her B.S. in Nursing from New York University followed by an MA in Psychiatric Mental Health Nursing from Rutgers. She went on to help establish the Impaired Nurses Program in Georgia which served as a model for other states. She taught at the Nell Hodgson School of Nursing at Emory University from 1967
