## Collection Description

### Biographical Note

Wesley Memorial Hospital was established by the North and South Georgia Conferences of the Methodist Church in February of 1904. It was first housed in the "Calico House" – so named because the swirled effect of the painted exterior resembled a pattern of calico fabric that was popular at the time. The former private residence, which stood on the southwest corner of the intersection of Courtland St. and Auburn Avenue, had served as headquarters of General Wm. T. Sherman during the Federal occupation of Atlanta in 1864. After extensive renovations, it was formally opened on August 16, 1905. The hospital also accommodated a nurses' training school, the forerunner of today's Nell Hodgson Woodruff School of Nursing at Emory University.

In 1922 a new facility was built on the campus of Emory University. The hospital was not formally associated the Emory School of Medicine until 1925. In 1932 the name was changed to Emory University Hospital.

### Scope and Content Note

The Wesley Memorial Hospital records consist of a small number of administrative records and correspondence; memorabilia and other documentation of two volunteer organizations related to the hospital; scattered publications related to the Hospital; one photograph; newspaper clippings and other memorabilia.

Administrative records primarily document the construction of the hospital on the Emory University campus in the early 1920s. Also included are annual reports from 1905 and 1906 when the institution was first established and staff meeting minutes for 1911-1930. Correspondence concerns the solicitation of funds for the painting of a life-size portrait of Asa Candler that would hang in the main entry of the new hospital building and other matters pertaining to the construction of the building.

Organizational records document the work of the Wesley Memorial Hospital Training School Alumni Association; the Woman's Auxiliary, formed to support the volunteer work done for the hospital; and the Baby Alumni Association, an outgrowth of the work of the Woman's Auxiliary. The Baby Alumni Association scrapbook (Box 2) provides an interesting presentation of the history of the group and the Lucy Elizabeth Pavilion, the obstetrical wing of the hospital.

The small collection of publications, clippings and memorabilia provide information about the history of the hospital and the changes in regulations for staff and patients between 1905 and 1929.
