Charles Wesley, D. D. was Subdean of the Chapel Royal at St. James Palace, London. He was the son of Samuel and Charlotte Wesley and the grandson of Charles Wesley.

**Scope and Content Note**

This letter was written by Wesley on May 29, 1840 to George Roland in Edinburgh, Scotland. In this humorous letter Wesley discussed personal matters, primarily the appointment of a mutual friend to a position and the effects of aging on one's personal appearance.
