## Collection Description

### Biographical Note

James Henderson Blount (1869-1918) was born in Clinton, Georgia, graduated from the University of Georgia in 1887 and the Columbia University Law School in 1891. He served in the Spanish American War and as special representative of the state department in Santo Domingo during the revolution of 1914. He was U.S. district judge in the Philippines 1901-1905 and resigned because of ill health. He was the author of *Georgia Forms and Practices* (1898); *American Occupation of the Philippines* (1912); and many magazine articles dealing largely with Philippines.

### Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of ten letters (1900-1919) written by Blount to *North American Review* editor, David A. Monroe.
