Processing

Born digital materials processed, arranged, and described by Brenna Edwards, April 2020. Born digital materials include files taken from two internal hard drives.

Forensic disk images were created from the hard drives using GuyMager. Individual files were extracted using FTK Imager and scanned for viruses using McAfee's anti-virus software; none were found. Duplicate and system files have been removed, and files were scanned for personally identifiable information; none were found. Text-based files were migrated to PDF using Adobe Acrobat and image files were migrated to JPG using GIMP. File dates have been changed from the original creation date. Access copies retain original folder titles and file names.

Collection Description**Biographical Note**

Valerie Boyd is an African American biographer, educator, and journalist. She was born in Atlanta, Georgia, in 1963 to Roger Boyd, a blue-collar businessman, and Laura Boyd, a homemaker. She grew up in the Collier Heights neighborhood and attended Atlanta public schools. Boyd received a bachelor's degree in journalism from Northwestern University (Evanston, Illinois) in 1985 and earned a Master of Fine Arts degree in creative nonfiction from Goucher College (Baltimore, Maryland) in 1999. She co-founded the magazine *HealthQuest* (1992), the first nationally distributed magazine focused specifically on African American health, and founded the magazine *EightRock* (1990), a black arts and culture publication. Boyd has published articles and essays in numerous national and local publication, including *The Washington Post*, *The Los Angeles Times*, *Creative Nonfiction*, *The Oxford American*, *Paste*, *Ms.*, *Essence*, and *Atlanta Magazine*. From 1989-1995, she was the Assistant Editor of *Catalyst*,

an arts magazine founded and edited by Pearl Cleage, and has also served as Arts Editor for *The Atlanta Journal-Constitution*. Boyd published *Wrapped in Rainbows*, her award-winning biography of Zora Neale Hurston, in 2003. She is the Charlayne Hunter-Gault Distinguished Writer in Residence and Associate Professor of Journalism at the University of Georgia (Athens) Grady College of Journalism and Mass Communication.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the papers of Valerie Boyd from circa 1981-2017 and includes audiovisual material, correspondence, journalism, personal papers, research files, teaching files, and writings by others. Audiovisual material contains recordings of interviews Boyd conducted as journalist of African American cultural figures such as Maya Angelou, Toni Cade-Bambara, Toni Morrison, and August Wilson, among many others. There are also numerous commercial film and video recordings that Boyd used in her research and teaching. The collection also contains Boyd's reporter's notebooks and published articles, as well as the records of *HealthQuest* and *EightRock*. Research files relate primarily to Boyd's biography of Zora Neale Hurston, *Wrapped in Rainbows*. They include drafts and proofs of the book, as well as copies of records held in other archival repositories. Teaching files document Boyd's work at the University of Georgia. Born digital materials date from 1993 to 2009, and include photographs, research files, teaching files, and writings.
