## **Collection Description**

### **Biographical Note**

Reese Cleghorn (1930-2009) was a journalist and author from Summerville, Georgia. He attended college at Emory University in Atlanta where he received a bachelor's degree in journalism in 1950. He also attended Columbia University where he earned a master's degree in public law and government in 1957.

Cleghorn was a prominent journalist in Atlanta, working both for the *Atlanta Journal* and the Associated Press in the 1960s. In the 1970s, he led the editorial department of the *Charlotte Observer* in North Carolina. He was known for his support of civil rights, and was co-author, with Pat Watters, of the book *Climbing Jacob's Ladder: The Arrival of Negroes in Southern Politics*.

In 1981, Cleghorn became dean of the University of Maryland's journalism department, where he served until 2000. He died in March 2009 of heart disease.

### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection consists of the papers of journalist Reese Cleghorn from circa 1960-2009, including typescript news articles, correspondence, notes, research files, printed material and photographs.
