Collection Description**Biographical Note**

The Cummington Press was founded as a part of the Cummington School of the Arts, a summer program emphasizing collaborations across the fine arts, directed by musician Katharine Frazier in Cummington, Massachusetts. In 1939, Harry Duncan (1916-1997) began attending the Cummington School summer sessions during breaks from his graduate education at Duke University. That year, Frazier invested in an antique hand-press with the aim of introducing Cummington students to manual printing. The participants in the school, led by Duncan, made their first attempts to operate the press from 1939-1940, and by 1941 had completed the first book under the Cummington Press imprint, an edition of whaling letters titled *Incident on the Bark Columbia*.

Frazier and Duncan began printing in earnest, collaborating on the production of books by authors such as R.P. Blackmur and Wallace Stevens. At this time Katharine Frazier began to suffer from the cancer that would take her life in 1944, and though Frazier remained an intellectual collaborator, her involvement in further book production was limited. In the year of Frazier's passing, Duncan met Paul Wightman Williams, Jr., a poet and illustrator, who began to participate in book production, providing woodcut illustrations for several volumes. At this time, the Cummington Press published additional works by Stevens and Blackmur, as well as works by Robert Lowell, William Carlos Williams, Robert Penn Warren, Allen Tate, and Marianne Moore. The press also published translations of Rainer Maria Rilke and works by earlier authors, including Daniel Defoe and Charles Dickens. This productive period was interrupted by a car accident that took Paul Williams' life in 1957.

In the following years Harry Duncan balanced printing with academic appointments at the University of Iowa and the University of Nebraska. In 1957, Duncan was invited to join the University of Iowa faculty to teach typography and book arts for the School of Journalism. Duncan accepted, continuing to operate The Cummington Press part-time in Iowa City. During this time the Cummington Press began to publish works by poets involved with the University of Iowa Writer's Workshop, including writers whose careers had not yet been established, depending less on contact with established writers to procure manuscripts. In 1972, Duncan was offered a faculty position at the University of Nebraska which enabled him to teach half-time and print half-time. He established the Abbatoir Editions imprint for works published under the auspices of the University of Nebraska, while continuing to produce Cummington Press works. Duncan remained at Nebraska until retiring in 1985; recognized by the printing community and the general public as a critical figure in the post-war small press movement. Duncan continued book production until his death in 1997.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the records of the Cummington Press and the personal papers of Harry Duncan from 1933-1998. Records of the press include subject files, business correspondence, manuscripts, administrative and financial records, printed material, and photographs. In addition to the Press records, the collection also includes the personal papers of Harry Duncan, such as family correspondence, teaching materials, and his writings. Other personal papers include a small amount relating to Katherine Frazier and Paul Wightman Williams.

The series consists of the records of the Cummington Press from 1939-1997. Records include subject files, business correspondence, manuscripts, administrative and financial records, printed material and photographs. The subject files are likely the first set of files maintained by the Press, covering the years 1939-1980, and include correspondence and other material pertaining to the business of running the press and the Cummington School of the Arts. The next subseries, the business correspondence, consists of a separate set of files Duncan kept, maintained from 1939 through 1997, that also contains correspondence relating to the business of operating the Press. Correspondents include authors, book-binders, paper suppliers, illustrators, customers, librarians, publishers, bookstore owners, and other printers.

The manuscripts subseries contains files relating to works published by the Cummington Press or accepted for publication but never completed, general manuscript submissions and illustration submissions. The administrative and financial records (1940-1997) include annual reports, accounting and banking records, financial correspondence, invoices, sales records, and tax records. Printed material consists of printing samples, invitations, prospectus, and other material produced by both the Cummington Press and other small presses, such as the Perishable Press. The photographs include images of Harry Duncan and the Cummington Press from the 1940s-1990s, such as individual portraits and snapshots of Duncan and images of Duncan with Paul Williams and other members of the printing press community.

Scope and Content Note

The subseries consists of subject files relating to the Cummington Press collected by Harry Duncan, co-founder of the press with Katherine Frazier, from 1939-1980. The subject files primarily include correspondence pertaining to the Cummington Press and the Cummington School of the Arts. Paper samples, binding samples, and drafts of illustrations and woodcuts are also included in the series. Duncan's relationship to the art of fine press book printing is documented in extensive correspondence with fellow letterpress printers, illustrators, suppliers of ink and paper, book binders, and designers and distributors of type.

In addition to the business of the press, the series also includes correspondence with many of the prominent American poets published early in their careers by the Cummington Press. Such notable authors include Katherine Hoskins, Robert Lowell, Robert Mezey, Marianne Moore, Wallace Stevens, Allen Tate, Robert Penn Warren, and William Carlos Williams. This series also documents correspondence with other literary figures, such as Caroline Monica Gordon, whose letters to and from Duncan are about Catholicism, Gordon's relationship with Allen Tate, and discussions about both Gordon and Duncan's writings. The correspondence also includes application and award information from the American Institute of Graphic Arts "Fifty Books of the Year" and the National Endowment for the Arts grant, which was awarded to the Cummington Press from 1968-1970.

Scope and Content Note

The subseries consists of business correspondence relating to the Cummington Press from 1939-1997. Included are letters to and from the founding members of the press, Katherine Frazier, Harry Duncan, and later collaborator, Paul Wightman Williams. Correspondents include authors, book-binders, paper suppliers, illustrators, customers, librarians, publishers, bookstore owners, and other printers. The letters discuss all matters involved in printing, from the initial submission and selection of manuscripts, to the business of distributing and selling the finished titles. Of particular note is the correspondence between Duncan and other prominent small press printers, such as Walter Hamady (Perishable Press), Victor and Carolyn Hammer, Kim Merker (Windhover Press and the Stone Wall Press), and Juan Pascoe (Taller Martín Pescador). There is a significant gap in the correspondence for the years 1972 and 1986, during which Duncan was teaching at the University of Omaha and printing titles under the Abbatoir imprint. The business correspondence resumed once Duncan retired from the University and revived the Cummington Press, and continued until his death in 1997.

Scope and Content Note

The subseries contains manuscripts published by the Cummington Press, manuscripts that were accepted for publication but never completed, and general manuscript submissions and illustration submissions from 1939-1997. In the first section are materials relating to published works, including correspondence, manuscripts and typescripts, illustrations and page proofs. Of note are files relating to the publication of William Carlos Williams' *The Clouds*, *Aigeltinger*, *Russia*, &c, the full manuscript of which includes poems removed from the final printing. Also included are files relating to the publication of *Incident on the Bark Columbia*, a collection of 19th-century whaling letters published for the first time by the Cummington Press.

The subseries also contains files relating to works accepted for publication by the Cummington Press, but not printed for various reasons. Along with correspondence and typescripts, notable materials include Katharine Frazier's unpublished transcriptions of letters from the Goodell family written during the California Gold Rush, as well as poet Robert Peters' lyric memoir of coming to terms with his homosexuality. The third section includes manuscripts submitted to the Cummington Press, but not accepted for publication, including manuscripts by Malcolm Cowley and William Carlos Williams. The final section contains illustration submissions to the Cummington Press.

The subseries consists of the administrative and financial records of the Cummington Press from 1940 to 1997. Records include annual reports, accounting and banking records, financial correspondence, invoices, sales records, and tax records. Of particular note are the early accounting records and reports of the Cummington Press after it became part of the Cummington School of the Arts in late 1939. The subseries also includes records from the subsequent period when the Press was no longer associated with the School, starting in 1954 when Duncan and Paul Wightman Williams re-opened the Press in Rowe, Massachusetts. Also of note are the sales record books that Duncan maintained while he continued to print under the Cummington Press imprint throughout the 1960s and 1970s, in which he recorded the bookstores and individuals who purchased each of the titles.

Scope and Content Note

The series consists of the personal papers of Harry Duncan, Katherine Frazier, and Paul Wightman Williams from 1933 to 1998. Harry Duncan's personal papers span from circa 1939 to 1998 and include personal and family correspondence, a notebook of manuscript writings, photographs from the Cummington School of Arts and Crafts, teaching materials and lectures, and writings. Of particular interest is a cache of letters to and from Katherine Frazier, the founder of the Cummington School of the Arts. They include discussions about the printing press, relationships with authors, and Katherine's illness. Duncan's writings include biographical essays, scholarly works, graduate essays, lectures, librettos, music scores, translations, and original poems. Many of the lectures focus on fine press printing and technology, while the essays are primarily literary criticism or discussions of politics and philosophy. The librettos are commissioned translations on classical and religious themes, and some of the music scores are written for the poems of W. B. Yeats.

Katherine Frazier's personal papers contain fiction and non-fiction writings. One manuscript is dated 1933, and the others are undated. The writings are experimental, blending prose and poetry and emphasizing the musicality of language, and cover topics such as art, war, mathematics, and philosophy.

The personal papers of Paul Wightman Williams span 1943 to 1954. In addition to a substantial collection of original poetry manuscripts, the papers include long letters from Williams' family, military correspondence, Cummington Press business, and visual materials such as architectural plans for a Cummington Press house and a photograph of original paintings.
