Collection Description**Biographical Note**

George Peddy Cuttino, educator and historian, was born March 9, 1914, in Newnan, Georgia, the second son of Kattie May Peddy and David Smith Cuttino II.

He graduated from Swarthmore College (1935), University of Iowa (1936), Oxford University (1938) and did post-doctoral study at the Institute of Historical Research, University of London (1938-1939). He was a professor of history at University of Iowa (1939-42; 1946), Bryn Mawr College and Swarthmore College (1946-1952), and at Emory University (1952-1984). Cuttino was also a Rhodes Scholar (1936-1939), a Guggenheim Foundation Fellow (1947-1948; 1953-1954), and a recipient of the Haskins Medal from the Medieval Academy of America (1979). Among other honors and honorary positions Cuttino held at Emory University are the Candler Chair in Medieval History (1980), and the position of Chief Marshal (1976-1984). In addition to being a scholar of medieval history, he is a genealogist and the author of *Saddle Bags and Spinning Wheel*, the collected letters of his grandparents, and a *History of the Cuttino Family*.

Cuttino died October 4, 1991 at Piedmont Hospital in Atlanta, Georgia, of complications from a stroke. His remains were interred in Oak Hill Cemetery, Newnan; Georgia.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains papers of George Peddy Cuttino from 1930-1990. The genealogical materials in Series 1 consist of materials collected by Dr. Cuttino and by his grandfather, David Smith Cuttino, Sr. (1842-1925) concerning the "Cothonneau" family in France, as French Huguenot refugees to America, and as citizens of the state of South Carolina; as well as related branches of the family. Dr. Cuttino is the author of *Saddle Bags and Spinning Wheel*, the collected letters of his grandparents George W. Peddy and Kate Featherston Peddy, and *History of the Cuttino Family*. The personal papers in Series 2 consist of records having to do with some aspects of his personal life, but primarily relate to his career as a scholar and teacher of medieval history.

Scope and Content Note

The genealogical materials in Series I are divided into three subseries; each series is named for a branch of Cuttino's family and each represents different aspects of his genealogical research. A brief description and box list for each subseries follows:

Scope and Content Note

This series is composed largely of material collected by Dr. Cuttino in preparation for the publication of *History of the Cuttino Family* (1982). The bulk of the papers is original and photocopied correspondence (1795-1982) the earliest of which are: a letter (1795) from Savage Smith of Georgetown, S.C., to Reverend Richard Furman, concerning his forthcoming marriage to Elizabeth Cuttino, oldest child of William Cuttino; letters from Peter Cuttino, brother to Elizabeth, to the Reverend Iverson Brooks (photocopies, 1822) and the Reverend Peter Ludlow (1828); and a series of letters (1828-1829) from Archar Benjamin Smith, son of Savage Smith and Elizabeth Cuttino, to his first wife Mary DeWees. Remaining general correspondence is that between G.P Cuttino and persons knowledgeable in Cuttino family history.

Family records include a photocopy of the certificate of sale of land lot no. 88, Georgetown, S.C., to Elizabeth Coon Cuttino (Mrs. William Cuttino), 1816; the transcript of the will of Henry Cuttino (1854) reproduced in the *History of the Cutting Family*; recollections of Thomas Peter Smith, ca. 1900; application to the South Carolina Huguenot Society; and a "Genealogy of the Cothonneau Family." Also found in these papers and reproduced in the history is the Cuttino coat of arms and photographs of Cuttino ancestors. A ledger book entitled "Swinton of Swinton" relates the family genealogy of Josephine Saluda Swinton (Mrs. David S. Cuttino, Sr.).

Miscellaneous materials included in this series are news articles and obituaries, family reunion information, "family trees," Confederate States of America muster rolls, material concerning Revolutionary War hero Denis Cotteneau, and a history of Ile de Re', the ancestral home. Short manuscripts written by various family members and two Bibles complete the series.
