Collection Description**Biographical Note**

Thulani Davis (1948-) is an African American journalist, poet, playwright, and novelist. She graduated from Barnard College, and attended graduate school at the University of Pennsylvania and Columbia University. In addition to articles in periodicals such as the *Village Voice*, *Nation*, *New York Times*, and *Washington Review*, she has published several anthologies of her poems, a play, the libretto for an opera, and several novels, including *1959* and the *Maker of Saints*.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains material collected by Thulani Davis from 1967-1997, including correspondence, subject files, writings, photographs, and printed material. Of particular interest are a number of fliers and posters documenting performances, exhibits, lectures, and other events related to African American history and culture in New York City. The collection also includes recordings of interviews Davis conducted with Jesse Jackson during his presidential campaign in 1987-1988, and other individuals including Marion Barry, Andrew Young, Paul Carter Harrison, Roger Wilkins, Ron Walters, Tom Cavanaugh, Kenny Cockerel, and Coleman Young.
