Grace McKinley Holmes DeLorme (1906-1997), African American teacher from Atlanta, Georgia. She married Gilbert Earle DeLorme in 1929 and had a son Gilbert DeLorme, Jr. in 1945.

The collection contains papers of Grace McKinley Homes DeLorme and her family. The papers include personal and professional papers including correspondence, photographs, scrapbooks, and printed material. Especially significant in this collection are hundreds of photographs of the Holmes and DeLorme family, some of which were taken by African American photographers.
