Collection Description**Biographical Note**

Pearlie Craft Dove was born in Atlanta Georgia to Lizzie Dyer and Dan Cecile Craft. She graduated from Booker T. Washington High School in 1937. In the same year she enrolled in Clark University, where she received a B.A. in Home Economics and Elementary Education in 1941. Immediately following graduation she applied to Atlanta University where she received her Masters Degree in Elementary Education.

Pearlie Craft married Reverend Jackson Benjamin Dove on January 20, 1945. After the death of her husband, she went on to pursue her Doctorate Degree in Education from the University of Colorado in 1954 and completed the program in 1959. Mrs. Dove taught education at Clark College while also serving as the Director of Student Teaching from 1949 to 1963. Mrs. Dove went on to become Cluster Coordinator for The Atlanta Project, sponsored by the Carter Center, where she served from 1992-1996. The mission of The Atlanta Project is to improve the quality of life in our neighborhoods by helping the areas' residents to better identify and meet human needs. Dove died on August 18, 2015.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the personal papers of Pearlie Craft Dove from 1958-1996. The collection includes correspondence, photographs, newspaper clippings, her vita, speeches, writings, oral history interviews, black history calendars and records relating to The Atlanta Project.

The materials relating to The Atlanta Project (1992-1996) consist of minutes, newsletters, proposals, strategic plans, reports, and information on programs and projects sponsored by the project. Also, the collection contains a videotape from the Washington Cluster of The Atlanta Project.
