#### **Biographical Note**

Kathryn Caldwell Fink Dunaway, activist and chairman of the Stop ERA Committee of Georgia, was born ca. 1906, place unknown, and died September 16 1980, in Atlanta, Georgia. She began

her political involvement about 1940 and held offices in the Eagles Forum, a conservative legislation lobbying group, and the Daughters of the American Revolution; she conducted good citizenship contests in local schools, belonged to several groups associated with the Republican Party, and was chairman of United States Day in Georgia (1975), before she became active with the Stop ERA Committee of Georgia.

**Scope and Content Note**

The collection consists of correspondence, subject files, and printed materials focusing on women's issues and Dunaway's activities with civic and political committees.
