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**Collection Description****Biographical Note**

Thomas Hopkins English (1895-1992) was born in Dow, Illinois. He attended Blackburn College and completed his education at Princeton University (Litt.B, 1918; A.M., 1922; Ph.D., 1924). He married Rachel Marshall Willet (1897-1975) in June 1924. Prior to entering Princeton's graduate school, he served a brief period in the army. He was an instructor in English at the University of Wisconsin in 1920-1921, taught at Yale in 1924-1925 and at Princeton summer school in 1923-1927. He left Yale in 1925 to accept an assistant professorship in English at Emory University. He remained at Emory for the remainder of his academic career becoming an associate professor in 1928 and a full professor in 1933. He was named Professor Emeritus upon his retirement in 1964. He led an active professional life during his Emory career. He chaired the Department of English, 1942-1952, served on many committees, and edited *Emory Sources and Reprints*, 1943-1958, and *Emory University Quarterly*, 1945-1964. After his retirement, however, he continued his long association with the university by involving himself in library concerns, as well as in documenting the university's history in prose and verse.

After his retirement, Dr. English wrote *Emory University 1915-1965, A Semicentennial History* (Atlanta, 1966), as part of the university's 50th Anniversary celebration. In 1970 he played a major role in the organization of the Friends of the Library and served as editor and contributor to *Ex Libris*, an occasional publication of the Friends. Since that time he has continued to take an interest in holdings of the Robert W. Woodruff Library and has written a brief history of the library. Dr. English died of respiratory failure at Crawford Long Hospital in Atlanta, 8 January 1992. He was buried next to his beloved wife in the Princeton, New Jersey, Cemetery.

**Scope and Content Note**

The Thomas H. English papers contain correspondence, poetry, photographs, articles and speeches, scrapbooks, bookplates, greeting cards, memorabilia, subject files, medals, collected material, manuscripts, and an audio cassette and videocassette. These materials relate to Dr. English's teaching and writing career including his books, *Memory Verse: Thirty-five Years of Occasional Verse* (1953), *Emory University, 1915-1965: A Semicentennial History* (1966), *Afterthoughts: Occasional Verse, 1983-1986* (1986), and *Memory Book: Persons and Occasions*

*of a Long Life* (1989); his work as editor for *Emory University Quarterly* and *Emory Sources and Reprints*; other publications; and his participation in the Southern Humanities Conference; and his association with other poets and writers.

Correspondence includes letters exchanged between Dr. English and his parents (1906-1948), letters received from fellow Princeton graduate, Julius Lane Wilson (1918-1985), and letters and greeting cards received from friends, family and associates. Other correspondence in this collection includes letters pertaining to his ties and awards received at Blackburn College, Princeton University, and his retirement from Emory in 1964. Also included are three scrapbooks relating to Dr. English's friendship with Athos Menaboni. These scrapbooks contain correspondence between English and Menaboni, along with sketches and prints of Menaboni's work.

This collection also contains bookplates and commemorative medals collected by Dr. English. Collected material on A. B. Frost, Robert Woodruff, Dare Stones, miscellaneous authors, and other subjects is also included. Additional material received in 1994 includes personal items of Dr. English such as his black beret hat, Emory and Princeton ties, magnifying lenses, etc. Also included in these additions are correspondence and catalogs concerning his various academic appointments (1920-1989), scrapbooks (1916-1987), Library Endowment Fund scrapbook (1982-1988), and an over-sized drawing of Dr. English's bookplate.
