The collection contains transcripts from lectures given by southern journalists on racial segregation in schools.

The Office of Community Educational Services of Emory University provided short courses, workshops, and lectures that were geared toward members of the broader community. The short courses and special programs dealt with a wide range of topics and included current affairs, art appreciation, and professional development skills. The Office of Community Educational Services also sponsored the "Evening at Emory" short course program as well as the Emory University Reading Center.

**Scope and Content Note**

Materials in this series consist of course materials, lectures, transcripts, and clippings pertaining to courses, workshops, and lectures sponsored by Community Educational Services. Transcripts from the "Crisis in the Schools" lectures feature prominent southern journalists such as Ralph McGill and James Kilpatrick discussing racial segregation of public schools in the South.
