## **Collection Description**

### **Administrative History**

The National Humanities Faculty was founded in 1968 in Concord, Mass., as an affiliate program of Phi Beta Kappa in coordination with the American Council of Learned Societies and the American Council on Education, with funding from the National Endowment for the Humanities. The mission of the organization was to involve college and university professors in professional development programs primarily designed for teachers in secondary education. In 1974, the group became an independent non-profit and moved to the Emory University campus in 1981. The National Faculty moved to downtown Atlanta in 1994 and was dissolved in 2005.

### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection consists of administrative files, Board of Trustees meeting materials, program development records, regional office program records, major program records, faculty records, and funder and partner records of the National Faculty and its predecessors.
