The collection consists of the Hunnicutt family papers from 1830-1949. The papers include correspondence, printed material, speeches, a prospectus, and advertisements. Correspondence is among members of the Hunnicutt family and with others; subjects include prohibition, patent medicine, religion, and agriculture. Much of the correspondence is in the form of advertisements. Printed material includes sheet music, brochures, programs, pamphlets, catalogs, manuals, and
