Collection Description

Biographical Note

Michael Lomax, African American politician, educator, and businessman, was born in California in 1947 to Almena Davis Lomax and Lucius Lomax, Jr. He enrolled at Morehouse College (Atlanta, Georgia) at the age of 16 and graduated Phi Beta Kappa in 1968. He earned a master's degree from Columbia University (1971) and a Ph.D. from the Graduate Institute of Liberal Arts at Emory University (1984). His dissertation was entitled, *Counteé Cullen: From the Dark Tower*. He taught English and literature courses throughout the 1970s and 1980s at Emory University, the Georgia Institute of Technology, Morehouse College, and Spelman College. In 1994, he became president of the National Faculty, an organization which works to invigorate public schools through teacher development, and in 1997 became President of Dillard University in New Orleans, Louisiana.

Lomax first entered politics as a volunteer in Maynard Jackson's 1973 campaign for Mayor of Atlanta. Following Jackson's election, Lomax served as Director of Cultural Affairs (1975-1977) and Commissioner of Parks, Libraries and Cultural Affairs (1977-1978), both for the City of Atlanta. He was elected a Commissioner-at-large on the Fulton County Board of Commissioners in 1978, and served as Commission Chairman from 1981-1993. As Chairman, he was part of early efforts to bring the Olympics to Atlanta, was founder of the National Black Arts Festival, and led city government programs to combat HIV/AIDS. He ran for Mayor of Atlanta twice, in 1989 and 1993.

He was president and CEO of Amistad Corporation, a funeral services company, from 1991-1993. Lomax has also served on numerous boards and committees including Teach for America, the Studio Museum in Harlem, and the United Way, as well as a variety of boards and committees within Emory University and other educational institutions. He has been president and CEO of the United Negro College Fund since 2004.

In 1973, Lomax married playwright and novelist Pearl Cleage; the couple had one daughter, Deignan, before divorcing in 1979. He married Cheryl Ferguson, an executive at Coca-Cola, in 1987. They have two daughters, Michele and Rachel.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the papers of Michael Lomax from 1772-2010 (bulk 1965-2010) and includes personal papers, professional papers, printed material, photographs, audiovisual material, and born digital material. Personal papers contain correspondence, family papers, memorabilia, and other items documenting Lomax's education, recognition for his professional and political achievements, and relationships with family and friends. Family papers and genealogical research document Michael Lomax's paternal ancestry and include vital records such as birth, marriage and death certificates, wills of estate, prison and cemetery records, and other legal documents, as well as genealogical charts of the Deignan family, Lomax's paternal grandmother's family.

Professional papers illuminate Lomax's political and business ventures. Records of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners document projects and business between the Board and departments and committees such as the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games, Central Area Study II Public Safety Task Force, the Georgia Department of Human Resources' task force on Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS), the Fulton County Jail and Police, and the Fulton-Dekalb Hospital Authority. Campaign records include documents relating to Lomax's campaigns for public office, as well as records documenting Maynard Jackson's 1973 campaign for Mayor of Atlanta. The records detail the candidates' campaign administration, financial and fundraising activities, and campaign platforms on crime, housing, public safety, gay and lesbian rights and, women's rights. Writings by Lomax consist primarily of speeches made during his tenure as Chairman of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners and during his campaigns for public office, as well as drafts of scholarly works and fiction. Other professional papers are comprised of agendas; appointment books; board and committee files documenting Lomax's service on Boards of Directors of the National Black Arts Festival, Teach for America, the Studio Museum in Harlem, and the United Way; teaching and university files from Atlanta University Center, Morehouse College, Spelman College, and Dillard University; and the records of the Amistad Corporation.

Printed material contains articles about Lomax's political career, mostly featured in *Atlanta Magazine*, and newspaper clippings primarily covering his mayoral campaign in 1989. Other printed material consists of items collected by Lomax, including writings by his first wife Pearl Cleage and his brother Lucius Lomax, IV, and newsletters and other items documenting the Shrine of the Black Madonna. Photographs include Lomax family photographs, photographs relating to Lomax's genealogical research on the Deignan and Lomax families, images of and by Pearl Cleage, and professional and candid images of Lomax documenting his political career and his tenure in higher education administration as President of Dillard University and President and CEO of the United Negro College Fund. There are numerous photographs from Lomax campaign events and from Fulton County Board of Commissioners events. Audiovisual material primarily contains recordings relating to Lomax's campaigns for Fulton County Board of Commissioners (1978) and Mayor of Atlanta (1989), produced by Citizens for Lomax and Women for Lomax, in addition to a few items relating to the establishment of the Fulton County Jail Welfare Fund and the concept of "servant leadership."

The series consists of the personal papers of Michael Lomax from 1772-2009 (bulk 1965-2009), including correspondence, family papers and genealogical research, memorabilia, and other items. For correspondence relating to specific Fulton County departments and projects see Subseries 2.1, Fulton County Board of Commissioners records.

Personal papers primarily consist of materials relating to Lomax's academic pursuits, along with a small amount of material documenting Lomax's political activities as a student. Personal papers also contain memorabilia such as awards, buttons, badges, medals, paperweights, and plaques. Most items reflect recognition of Lomax's service and achievements from the NAACP, the Democratic National Convention, and Morehouse College. There are also a few promotional items from Lomax's political campaigns. Family papers and genealogical research document Michael Lomax's paternal ancestry and include vital records such as birth, marriage and death certificates, wills of estate, prison and cemetery records, and other legal documents, as well as genealogical charts of the Deignan family, Lomax's paternal grandmother's family.

The series consists of the professional papers of Michael Lomax from 1965-2007 and includes records of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners, campaign records, writings by Lomax, and other professional papers. Records of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners are comprised of advance sheets, financial records, interoffice memoranda, mailing lists, meeting talking points and briefing papers, phone messages, retreat planning files, and zoning and development planning files that document projects of the Board and of the City of Atlanta and Fulton County. Campaign records include documents relating to Michael Lomax's campaigns for Mayor of Atlanta and for the Fulton County Board of Commissions, as well as records documenting Maynard Jackson's 1973 campaign for Mayor of Atlanta, on which Michael Lomax worked. The records detail the candidates' campaign administration, financial and fundraising activities, and campaign platforms on crime, housing, public safety, gay and lesbian rights, and women's rights.

Writings by Lomax contain speeches, articles, book chapters, reviews, talking points for interviews and media appearances, drafts of unpublished novel *Fantasies of Affirmation: The 1920s Novel of Negro Life*, and Lomax's doctoral dissertation, *Countée Cullen: From the Dark Tower*. The overwhelming majority of the series consists of speeches given during Lomax's tenure as Chairman of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners and during his campaigns for political office. Other professional papers consist of agendas; appointment books; board and committee files documenting Lomax's service on the Boards of Directors of the National Black Arts Festival, Teach for America, the Studio Museum in Harlem, and the United Way; teaching and university files from Atlanta University Center, Morehouse College, Spelman College, and Dillard University; and the records of the Amistad Corporation.

Advance sheets were the primary administrative planning document for Lomax's speaking engagements and other events. They include information about the organization requesting he speak, the event itself, the name of the staff person assigned to coordinate with the organization and/or draft talking points, and are often attached to correspondence with the organization. Additional advance sheets can be found in Subseries 2.2, Writings, attached to texts of speeches given by Lomax. Department of Finance files contain the financial records of Fulton County which mostly consist of budget reviews, expense sheets, and requisition status reports.

The series also includes office files documenting projects and business between the Board and City of Atlanta departments and committees such as the Atlanta Committee for the Olympic Games, Atlanta Chamber of Commerce, Central Area Study II Public Safety Task Force, Metropolitan Atlanta Rapid Transit Authority (MARTA), the Clean Community Commission, Department of Family and Child Services, Department of Finance, Department of Planning and Economic Development, and Georgia Department of Human Resources' task force on Acquired Immunodeficiency Syndrome (AIDS). The records also contain correspondence, planning files, memoranda, conference details, newspaper articles, and pamphlets and fliers for City of Atlanta events such as the Black Family Project and King Week hosted by the Martin Luther King, Jr. Center for Nonviolent Social Change, as well as proclamations and the summary of the Georgia General Assembly. Records of Lomax's campaigns for Mayor of Atlanta and the Fulton County Board of Commissioners document Lomax's campaign platforms on crime, housing, public safety, gay and lesbian rights and women's rights, and also include campaign research, such as surveys of voter attitudes in Atlanta and opposition research. Records of Citizens for Lomax primarily contain information about campaign financing and fundraising activities. The subseries also includes mailing lists and volunteer lists for his campaigns.

Maynard Jackson mayoral campaign files are comprised of records of the 1973 campaign run by Lomax as well as records of the 1989 campaign run against Lomax. This includes campaign platforms on crime, education, economic development, taxes and public transportation, as well as drafts of speeches given to the National Organization for Women and the Atlanta Press Club. One notable speech included in the subseries is the State of the City Address (1975), originally drafted by Pearl Cleage in 1974. Additional files contain background materials pertaining to public debate on local and national black leadership, forced sterilization, legal aid, and Vietnam veterans. The subseries also includes a small number of files relating to Jackson's Mayoral administration.

Scope and Content Note

The subseries consists of writings by Michael Lomax from 1971-2004 including speeches, articles, book chapters, reviews, talking points for interviews and media appearances, drafts of an unpublished novel, and his doctoral dissertation, *Countée Cullen: From the Dark Tower*. The overwhelming majority of the series are speeches given during his tenure as Chairman of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners. These include welcome messages and greetings to conferences and meetings being held in Atlanta, remarks and formal proclamations at community events, and more substantive addresses such as those made at commencements. Many of the speech texts are attached to advance sheets and correspondence about the events, and often consist only of talking points or briefing papers drafted by members of Lomax's staff. There are additional campaign speeches made during years when Lomax was running for Mayor of Atlanta or the Board of Commissioners, and addresses given as President of Dillard University (New Orleans, Louisiana). Articles, book chapters, and reviews contain Lomax's scholarly work on topics of African American literature and culture, as well as several opinion pieces on local politics in Atlanta and New Orleans. The subseries also contains drafts of an unpublished novel, *Fantasies of Affirmation: The 1920s Novel of Negro Life* (1971), and a small number of notebooks and notes for unidentified works. There are a small number of writings by Pearl Cleage, Almena Lomax, Cheryl Lomax, and Lucius Lomax, IV, including an essay Cleage wrote in support of Lomax's 1993 campaign for Mayor of Atlanta. Additional writings by Almena Lomax are available in Series 6: Born digital material.

The subseries consists of other professional papers including agendas, appointment books, board and committee files, teaching and university files, and the records of the Amistad Corporation from 1970-2007. Agendas and appointment books include information about Lomax's personal and professional schedule. Board and committee files document Lomax's service on the Boards of Directors of the National Black Arts Festival, Teach for America, the Studio Museum in Harlem, and the United Way. They primarily include memoranda to the board members and board books for meetings.

Teaching and university files document Lomax's early teaching career and primarily include administrative records from the Atlanta University Center, Afro-American Studies Program. There are also administrative records relating to Lomax's employment as a lecturer at Morehouse College and Spelman College, but there are very few files documenting Lomax's teaching at those institutions. There is one folder of records relating to Lomax's tenure as President of Dillard University in New Orleans, as well as two folders documenting transition plans after he became President and CEO of the United Negro College Fund.

Amistad Corporation records consist of financial and other administrative documents such as invoices, tax returns, payroll records, correspondence, meeting minutes, insurance records, manuals, and legal records. The records reflect the operations of the company, including the acquisition of the Franklin-Strickland Funeral Home and the merger of Amistad Corporation with Wilson Financial Group. The subseries includes records of the Franklin-Strickland Funeral Home from before the acquisition, as well as documents relating to Amistad's plan for closing following the merger with Wilson.

Scope and Content Note

The series consists of photographs from 1843-2010 (bulk 1970-2010). The photographs include both professional and candid images of Lomax documenting his political career as well as his tenure in higher education administration as President of Dillard University and President and CEO of the United Negro College Fund. Noteworthy in this series is the large number of photographs of local Atlanta personalities, such as Maynard Jackson, Andrew Young, Frank Joe Harris, Coretta Scott King, Martin Luther King, III, Dexter Scott King, and Shirley Franklin, as well as national and international figures such as George H.W. Bush, George W. Bush, Bill Clinton, Hillary Clinton, Al Gore, Jesse Jackson, King Hussein of Jordan, Nelson Mandela, and Archbishop Desmond Tutu. There are additional photographs of Maynard Jackson's Mayor's Day for the Arts in 1975, which includes images of George Beaseley, Bill Cosby, Lev Mills, and Sidney Pointier; Charles Prince of Wales' visit to Atlanta in 1977; Lomax's UNCF events which include images of Aretha Franklin, Danny Glover, Denzel Washington, Oprah Winfrey, Stevie Wonder and others; and a photograph of a young Martin Luther King Jr. at Morehouse College circa 1948. The series also contains family photographs, photographs relating to Lomax's genealogical research on the Deignan and Lomax families, and images of and by Pearl Cleage.

Scope and Content Note

The series consists of born digital material including financial records of the Fulton County Board of Commissioners, writings by Almena Lomax, and photographs of the Studio Museum in Harlem trip to Venice, Italy. The Fulton County Board of Commissioners financial records consist entirely of spreadsheets. Writings by Almena Lomax contain essays as well as novels such as *The Women of Montgomery*. The original digital media consists of three compact disks, five 3.5" floppy disks, and eight 5.25" floppy disks.

Blank floppy disks have been discarded.

Processing

Born digital materials were processed by Sarah Quigley and Dorothy Waugh in 2017. Quigley and Waugh created images of twelve floppy disks using a Kryoflux and three compact disks using Guymager. Two additional floppy disks could not be imaged. Four floppy disks were blank and no data could be recovered from seven other disks due to degradation. Master copies of the images were ingested into a Fedora repository at Emory University for long-term preservation. Individual files were extracted from the disk images using FTK Imager and were scanned for viruses using McAfee's anti-virus software. The extracted files consist of Microsoft Word documents, Microsoft Excel spreadsheets, Microsoft Power Point presentations, dBase files, and photographs. The Microsoft Word files were migrated to PDF for access and use copies were made of the photographs in their original format. Spreadsheets were migrated from dBase to Microsoft Excel for access. Two blank spreadsheets and one spreadsheet that could not be rendered are not accessible. Power point files, Excel spreadsheets, and some Microsoft Word documents, all relating to the United Negro College Fund, could not be rendered and are not accessible. Additionally, two of the compact disks contained duplicate files and only one set of files is accessible. File names have been retained, but converting the Microsoft Word files to PDF changed the file dates.
