Biographical Note

James Vining Malcolm was born September 25, 1910 to James and Roberta Malcolm. He attended Emory University, graduating in 1932. In 1935 he graduated from Emory with a law degree. Malcolm practiced law in Atlanta. In 1942 he joined the army stationed at Kessler Field, Mississippi, and was then stationed in India (1943-1945). Malcolm married Drusilla Adams

and they had three daughters. He died November 17, 1990, and is buried at Westview Abbey in Atlanta.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the papers of James Vining Malcom from 1929-1945. The papers include letters exchanged between James Malcolm, his parents, and his wife, Drusilla. The correspondences discuss student life at Emory, family events, friends, and Malcom's experiences while in the military. Many of the letters go into great detail about fishing.
