Biographical Note

Carson McCullers (1917-1967), author of Southern-based fiction, was born in Columbus, Georgia.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the papers of Carson McCullers from 1941-1975. The papers include correspondence from McCullers to her friend, composer David Diamond (bulk 1941-1945) and collected materials relating to McCullers' career as an author. The letters, written from her homes in Columbus (Ga.), Nyack (N.Y.) and from Yaddo (an Artist's colony in Saratoga Springs, N.Y.) discuss her family, her work, and her relationship with husband Reeves McCullers.
