## **Collection Description**

### **Biographical Note**

Woodrow McKay (1893-1979), a photographer during World War I, was born July 26, 1893 in South Carolina. He died in North Carolina in 1979.

### **Scope and Content Note**

The collection consists of photographs taken by Woodrow McKay from circa 1917-1918. Photographic images, mostly in black and white, depict military airplanes and destruction, mostly in France, following bombing campaigns during World War I. Many of the photographs are aerial photographs.

### **Arrangement Note**
