Collection Description

Biographical Note

Carolyn Elaine Mitchell is an African American genealogist from Detroit, Michigan. She is the descendant of a Cherokee woman from North Carolina (Jones family), born approximately 1820. Mitchell's relatives in the Lindsay, Nelson and Lynch families lived in Michigan, mostly around Detroit, and Alabama.

Scope and Content Note

The collection contains material related to the Jones, Lindsay, Nelson, and Lynch families from circa 1890-1975. The material includes writings, genealogical charts, birth, military, and death records, photographs, and printed material. Writings include a handwritten speech by Alice Jones concerning women's rights. Genealogical charts and records were compiled by Carolyn Elaine Mitchell and document the family relationships between all the families in the collection. Photographs span the generations of families and date from circa 1890-1950. Some are copies. Printed material includes palm cards, postcards from African American resorts around Detroit, programs from a John Wesley Dobbs speech and an Emancipation Day celebration in Ontario, Canada, and an issue of the "Handy News," published by the Handy Music House.
