Collection Description

Biographical Note

Howard Washington Odum, sociologist, author, and educator, was born May 24, 1884, in Bethlehem, Georgia, and died November 8, 1954, in Chapel Hill, North Carolina. He received an undergraduate degree from Emory College (1904) and doctorates in psychology (Clark University, 1909) and in sociology (Columbia University, 1910); taught at the University of Georgia (1912-1919), and at Emory University (1919-1920; dean of the School of Liberal Arts);

and was Kenan Professor of Sociology at University of North Carolina (1920-1954) where he established the *Journal of Social Forces* (1922) and founded the Institute for Research in Social Services (director, 1924-1944). His areas of interest were African American folk literature and music, race relations, rural studies, the South, and adult education. He authored many books and articles, in addition to three novels (1928-1931).

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of manuscripts and manuscript drafts for five books and one book chapter written by Howard Washington Odum from 1929-1936. Manuscripts are for Odum's books: *An Introduction to Social Research* (with Katherine Jocher, 1929); *The Measure of a Changing Nation* (circa 1932); *Southern Regions of the United States* (1936); a chapter from *Recent Social Trends in the United States* ("Public Welfare" 1933); and two novels, *Wings On My Feet, Black Ulysses At The Wars* (1929); and *Cold Blue Moon, Black Ulysses Afar Off* (1931). The manuscripts are also available as published works.
