Collection Description

Biographical Note

Medora Field Perkerson (1892-1960), author, journalist, and editor, was born September 18, 1892, in Lindale, Georgia. She did some free-lance writing and wrote for the Rome, Georgia *Herald-Tribune* before she became a staff member of the *Atlanta Journal and Constitution Magazine* (assistant editor 1920; columnist 1940-1960), writing as personal advice columnist Marie Rose in addition to numerous articles. In 1922 she married Angus Perkerson, a journalist and editor of the *Atlanta Journal Magazine*. Perkerson was the author of two mysteries eventually made into motion pictures: *Who Killed Aunt Maggie?* (1939) and *Blood on Her Shoe* (1942). She also wrote *White Columns in Georgia* (1952), a non-fiction, historical work. She was president of the Georgia Chapter of the National League of American Pen Women and of the Atlanta Women's Press Club and served as president of the board of Atlanta Child Welfare Association. She was named an Atlanta Woman of the Year in 1952. Perkerson died June 6, 1960 in Atlanta, Georgia.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the papers of Medora Field Perkerson and her husband, Angus Perkerson, from 1905-1974. The papers include correspondence, photographs, clippings, scrapbooks, a manuscript, a thesis, and a screenplay. Perkerson's correspondence is between her publishers and other authors; some correspondence pertains to civic organizations in which she participated. Scrapbooks document the writing and publication of her books, the serialization of *Aunt Maggie* by the Associated Press, and the making of the two novels into movies. Mostly, the scrapbooks contain newspaper clippings, although some of them contain scattered correspondence and photographs, particularly the scrapbook compiled after her death. One scrapbook contains autographs of authors who participated in book signings in the Book Department of Rich's Department Store from 1937-1952.

The papers contain a number of Perkerson's writings, including newspaper clippings of articles by Perkerson and a typescript manuscript of *White Columns in Georgia*. Photographs are of persons Perkerson interviewed, her friends, and other authors and journalists including Margaret Mitchell and Angus Perkerson. The remaining papers contain a shooting script for the film version of *Who Killed Aunt Maggie?*, printed material concerning Angus Perkerson, and articles about Medora Field Perkerson.
