Biographical Note

The Manley A. Raymond family lived in New England. Manley A. Raymond and his wife Emily lived in New York City. His daughter, Alice G. Raymond and her husband James H. Biram, lived in Connecticut.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the Manley A. Raymond family papers from 1837-1959. The papers include a letter book (circa 1872-1876) containing those correspondences addressed to Manley A. Raymond from relatives and friends (some are in French and some in German); a diary (1874) kept by Raymond while studying in Europe; the diary (1883) of Mary Raymond; and the diary (1902) of his daughter, Alice G. Raymond, from her school days at Wesleyan Academy (Wilbraham, Mass.). The majority of the loose correspondence pertains to Alice Raymond, including letters (circa 1906-1946) from her father, friends, and relatives as well as from her husband, James H. Biram. Seven of Biram's letters to Alice were written while he was a doctor stationed in France at the end of World War I. Photographs in the collection document James H. Biram's college career at Amherst and also include family photographs.
