Historical Note

The San Marino Lodge No. 34 of the Free and Accepted Masons, Grand Lodge of Georgia, was chartered in 1821 in Greensboro, Georgia. From the 1840s until the 1990s, the lodge headquarters were located on the top floor of the Greene County courthouse. Prominent former members of the lodge include Georgia lawyer and politician William C. Dawson and Ignatius A. Few, the first president of Emory University.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of the records of the San Marino Lodge No. 34 of the Free and Accepted Masons, Grand Lodge of Georgia from circa 1820-2005. The records include correspondence, ledgers containing minutes and membership records, and printed material.
