Collection Description**Biographical Note**

Anderson M. Scruggs (1897-1955) was born February 18, 1897 at West Point, Georgia, and died January 28, 1955. He was the son of William Edgar and Talullah Eugenia (Watson) Scruggs. He married Miss Lelia Smith on November 23, 1921. They had one daughter Eugenia Elizabeth (Mrs. Otis J. White, Jr.).

Scruggs graduated from the Atlanta-Southern Dental College (later the School of Dentistry of Emory University) in 1925 and taught there as associate professor of histology, 1926-1939; associate in bacteriology and pathology, 1936-44; associate in technical composition, 1936-1937; professor of histology, Emory University School of Dentistry, 1944-1948; and professor of dentistry, 1949-55. Dr. Scruggs, who held the degree of Doctor of Dental Surgery, was a Fellow of the American College of Dentists, Poetry Society of America, Poetry Society of Georgia, American Dental Association, Georgia Dental Association, North District Dental Association, Omicron Kappa Upsilon and Psi Omega. He was the author of: "Glory of earth," 1933; "Ritual for myself," 1941; "I hear them in the dawn," 1948; set to music by William Naylor; other poems included in anthologies; *Prose, Poetry and Drama for Oral Interpretation*, 1936; *The Desk Drawer Anthology*, 1937; *The World's Great Catholic Poetry*, 1939; *Adventures in Poetry*, 1946; *The Story of Jesus in the World's Literature*, 1946; *Masterpieces of Religious Verse*, 1948; *What Shall the Heart Remember?*, 1951. Other publications are listed in the bound carbon copy of *What Shall the Heart remember?* along with biographical data and excerpts from reviews of Dr. Scruggs' poetry.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of correspondence (1926-1959), galley proofs and typescripts, photographs, scrapbooks, sheet music, lecture notes, memorabilia, and printed material. Materials are by or about Scruggs. Typescripts are of the manuscripts for two books of poems (there are also galleys for three books) and of three signed poems; most correspondence pertains to his poetry and its publication; lectures contain poems; memorabilia includes membership cards, a name plate, and a fountain pen; photographs are of Scruggs; printed material includes articles, clippings, pamphlets and books.
