Collection Description**Biographical Note**

Bell Irvin Wiley (1906- 1980), born in Hall, Tennessee, married Mary Frances Harrison in 1938; they had two sons. In 1949 Wiley was appointed professor of history at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, where he remained until retirement in 1974. He was particularly interested in the Civil War and published widely in that area.

Scope and Content Note

The collection consists of papers of Bell Irvin Wiley from 1928-1981. The papers include personal papers; general correspondence; writings, including books, articles, reviews and speeches; and research files primarily consisting of materials pertaining to the Civil War. The research materials include copies of letters, diaries, and other primary source material, most of it printed and some on microfilm. The collection also includes professional activity files pertaining to Wiley's involvement in historical associations and editorial boards; and teaching and administrative files relating to his service on the history faculty of Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia.

Scope and Content Note

The series consists of personal papers of Bell Irvin Wiley from ca. 1937-1979. The papers include personal diaries (ca. 1948-1979), photographs, clippings, awards and certificates, diplomas, and items regarding Wiley's education and military experience. Of particular interest are the personal diaries of research trips made while Wiley was professor of history at Emory University (Atlanta, Georgia). The trips were made for the purpose of gathering research materials for scholarly projects on which he was working, and the diaries provide detailed descriptions of his efforts.

Scope and Content Note

The series consists of general correspondence of Bell Irvin Wiley from 1932-1980. The correspondence includes telegrams, notes, memoranda, cards, and letters relating to many aspects of Wiley's personal life and to his writing and teaching career, primarily at Emory University (Atlanta, Ga.). The personal correspondence includes letters to Wiley and his wife Mary Frances Harrison Wiley, from family members regarding family news; letters from friends and former colleagues regarding professional activities and personal news; and letters pertaining to various living arrangements, including tenant occupation of the family home during Wiley's numerous research trips. Correspondence pertaining to Wiley's career relates to such matters as research for and publication of his works pertaining primarily to the Civil War, requests from former students seeking letters of reference, and inquires regarding history positions in various colleges and universities.
